3. Abstract:

Gavilan Joint Community College District,  Gilroy, California, is a 1650 FTE, 2-year comprehensive public community college serving a historically migrant-agricultural region that has a large under-represented & under-served Hispanic population. The college's Hispanic American student population has doubled in the past decade, with 1903 Latino students currently representing 44% of the 1999-2000 enrollment, (...forecast to reach 57% by 2003). Gavilan has been a Federally designated Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI) since 1993.

Transformation requires drastic investments & changes: Closing the "digital divide" is a fundamental problem for any traditional college. Old infrastructure & "chalk & talk" curriculum cannot support new styles of learning dictated by 21st Century Active or Engaged Learning strategies. Gavilan's Title 5 Project incorporates significant technology & infrastructure upgrading, together with necessary curriculum innovations. This is a Project is a **one-time investment with long-term payoff** that institutionalizes new learning paradigms.

Activity 1. \$1,345,035 over five years. Transforms the college into a 21st Century Learning College that is capable of delivering technology-enhanced student learning. Stresses increased student success, retention and persistence toward graduation by remediation of deep-seated barriers endemic in underrepresented & historically under-prepared rural populations. Effects qualitative changes that position the college to deliver the educational opportunities and curricula that are necessary in this information-connected digital age for success in the modern university environment and in the 21st Century workplace. Improves student access to faculty and to learning support systems through adoption of "Learning Anytime. Anyplace" concepts. (68% of Project funds)

Activity 2: \$280,634 over 5 yrs: Builds Institutional Advancement capacity, develops capacity to leverage local resources, and substantially increases the endowment. (14% of Project Funds)

Project Management and Evaluation: \$374,226 over 5 years. (18% of Project Funds)

This Project Proposal has been written entirely by Gavilan College Faculty, and is based upon the Goals defined in the College's 5 Year Educational Master Plan, approved by the Board of Trustees in January 2000.
