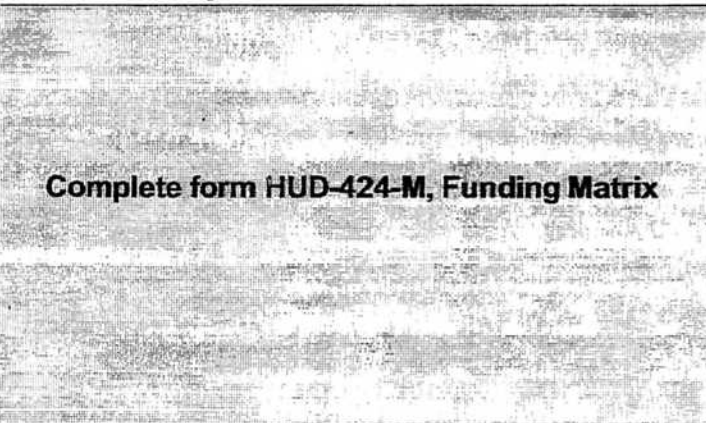

Abstract

Gavilan College of Gilroy California is a U.S. Dept of Education designated Hispanic Serving Institution. The college is a current Title V Hispanic Serving Institutions grantee and has recent prior experience as a HUD/HSIAC grantee. The project is located entirely in Gilroy's Census Tract 5126.01, site of a HUD approved local CDBG Neighborhood Revitalization Strategy (NRS) plan.

This proposed Gavilan College HSIAC project would create a collaboratively shared physical location in the heart of Gilroy's HUD approved Neighborhood Revitalization Strategy area (NRS area). The neighborhood education and technology center created by this project will enhance and leverage the currently separated efforts by GUSD, Gilroy City, the Regional Occupational Program (ROP) and Gavilan College.

The project will renovate and operate an existing 7200 sq ft "old school shop" building adjacent to the new GUSD neighborhood resource center portable buildings. The resulting complex would provide space for (A) enough adult education classes to meet the identified needs of the community for advanced ESL skills and job readiness skills and (B) a community technology center that helps breach the "Digital Divide" for neighborhood residents, and (C) a permanent location for needed expansion of the Regional Occupational Program (ROP) computer office applications skills classes that currently share limited space in the Old City Hall HSIAC location, (D) a permanent location for the skills laboratory of the City of Gilroy's NRS targeted "Mujeres Pueden" (Women Can) welfare-to-work job training program that is currently housed above a storefront on the main commercial street of the NRS area.
