

## **Student Profile of Opening Enrollment**

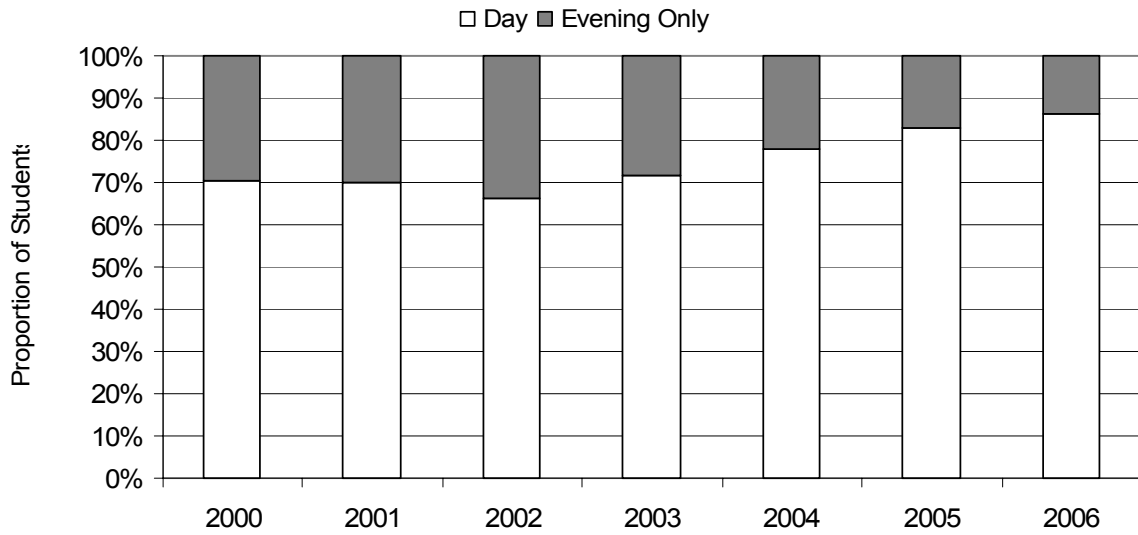
### **Summer 2000 – Spring 2006**

#### Summary of Findings

- Summer classes have a higher proportion of day students than Fall and Spring terms
- Most summer students are continuing from Spring 2006
- The median age of Gavilan students has remained at 23 to 24 years old - about one year younger than students in Fall and Spring terms
- Gender proportions have remained fairly constant with about 3 females for every 2 males
- The proportion of Latino and African American students increased very slightly
- Distance education classes draw college experienced students with a small number from beyond our service area

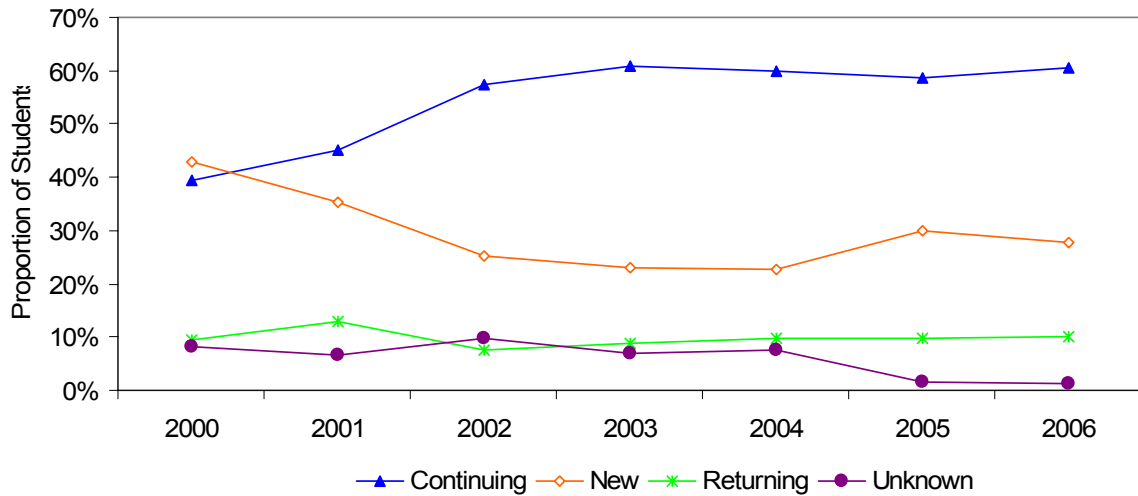

## Summer 2006 Day and Evening Enrollment



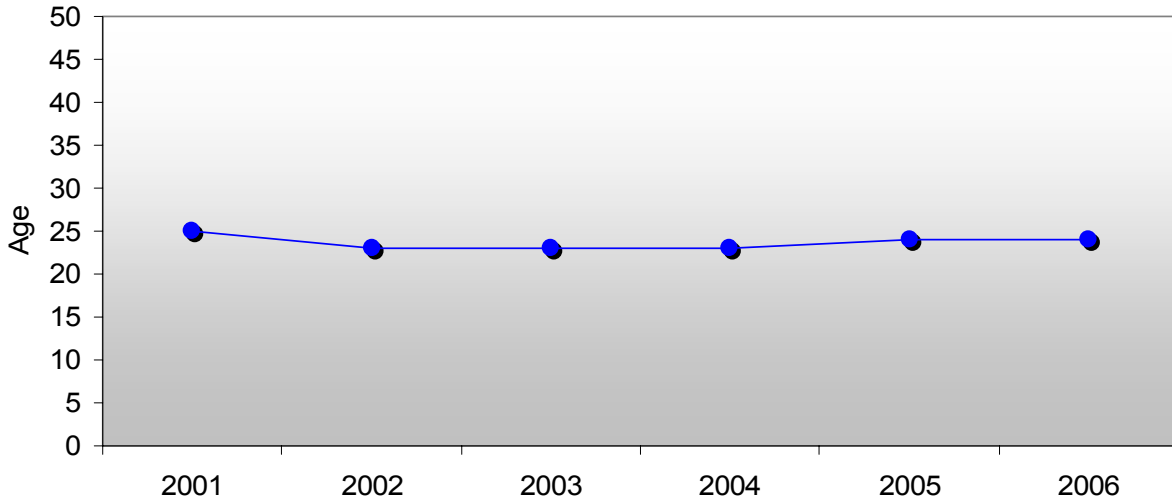

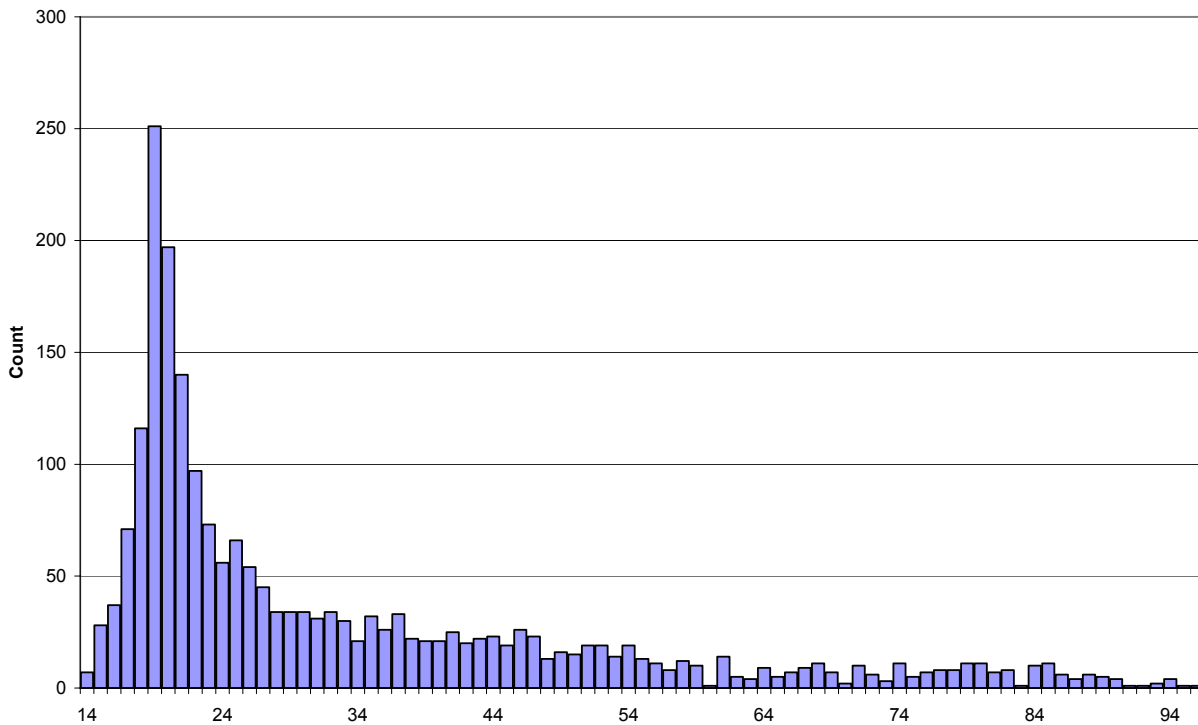

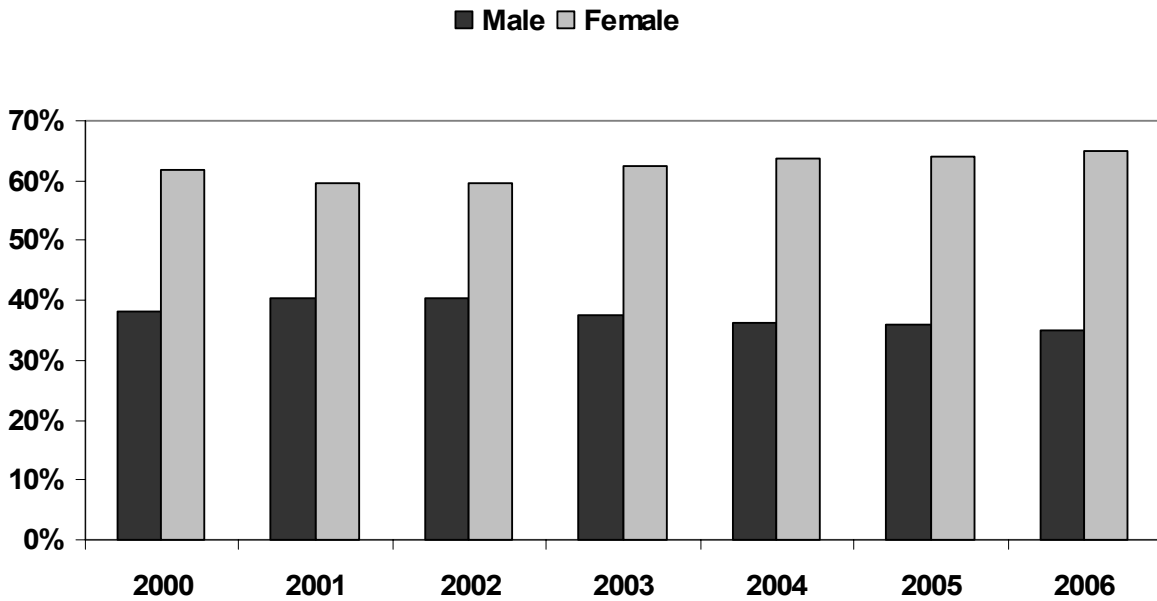

### Summer 2006 Age Distribution of Gavilan College Students

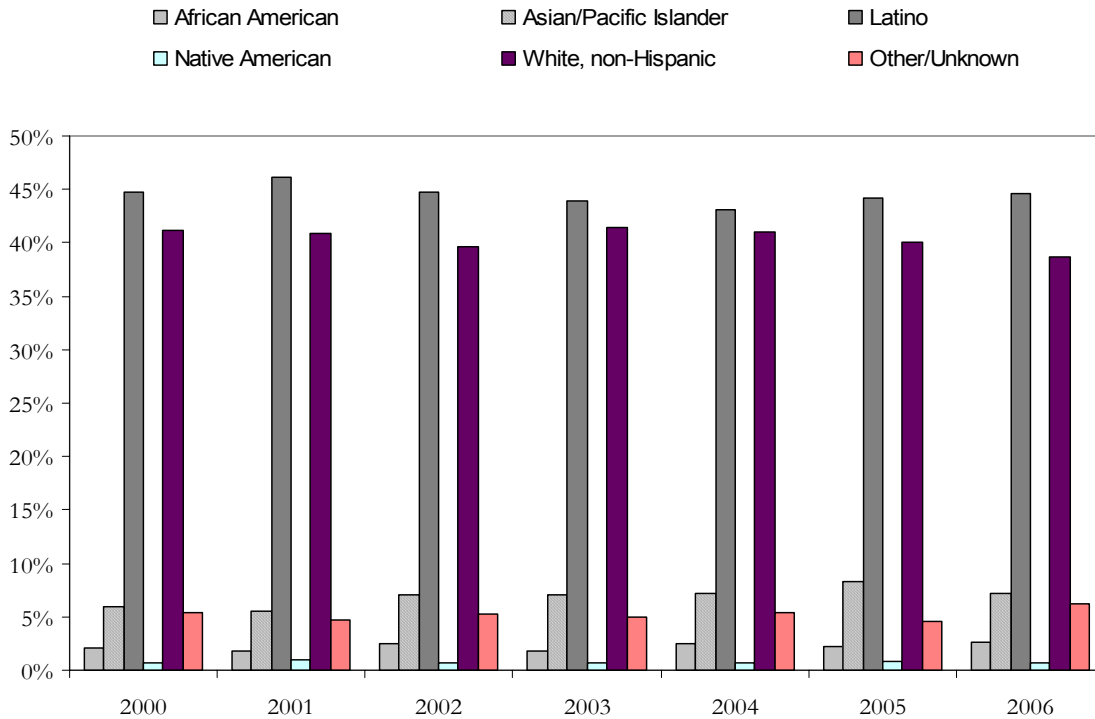

## Focus on Distance Education

This summer, 28 distance education classes were offered, with approximately 581 enrollments. The distance education student is typically characterized by:

- At least a high school education
- Prior college experience at Gavilan beyond 15 cumulative attempted units
- Native English speaking
- Degree oriented

Neither age, gender, or ethnicity appear related to the decision to take a distance education class.

Gavilan’s distance education classes appear successful in drawing a few students from outside our service area, including Lahaina, Hawaii, Long Beach, and Sacramento. Within the district, distance education classes appear proportionately more appealing to students in the northern end of the district, however Gilroy, Hollister, and Morgan Hill students numerically dominate enrollments.
