Spring 2002 – Spring 2007

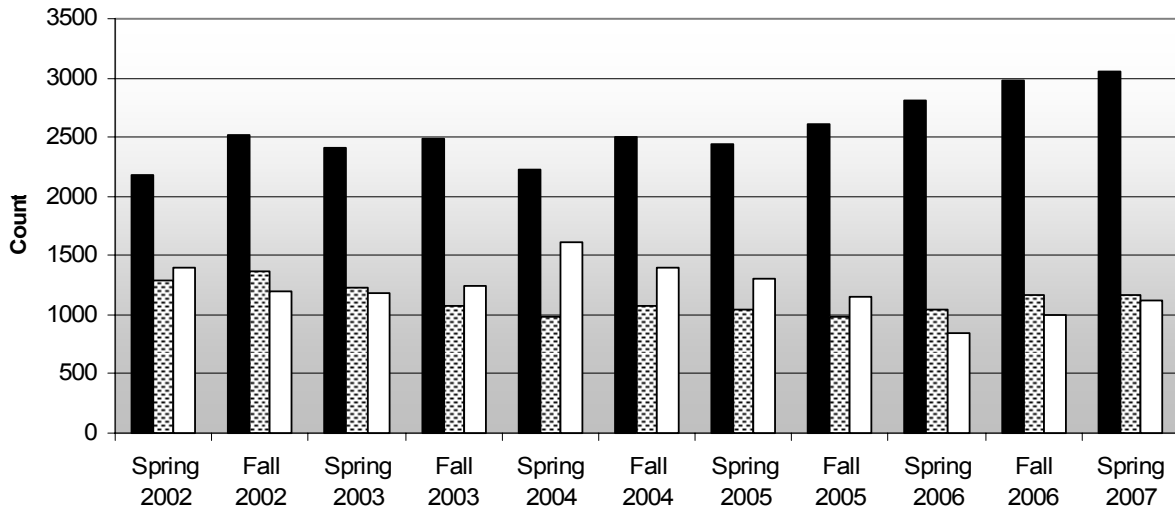
Summary of Findings

- A 2% increase in combined day/evening enrollment occurred this spring.
- The trend in higher continuing student enrollment in spring continues to hold.
- The median age of Gavilan students has been 24 for the past three semesters.
- The ration of male to female students is approximately 1:1.7.
- Latino student enrollment increased, white non-Hispanic enrollment decreased.

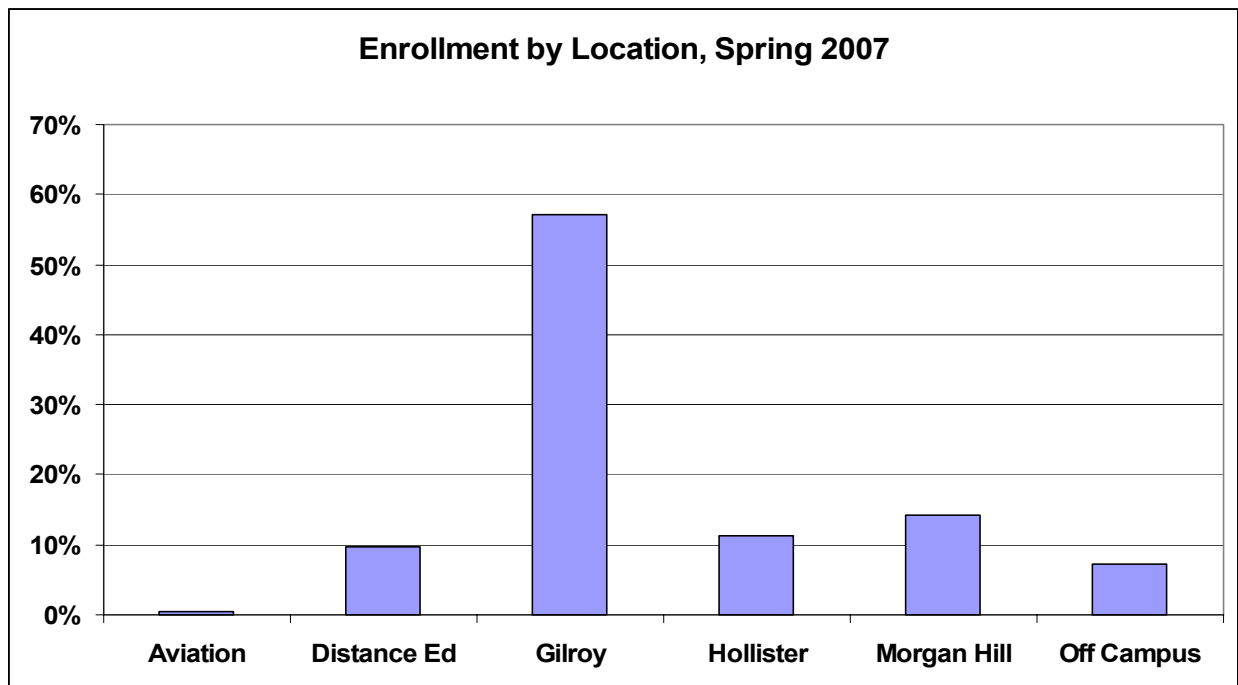

Day and Evening Enrollment

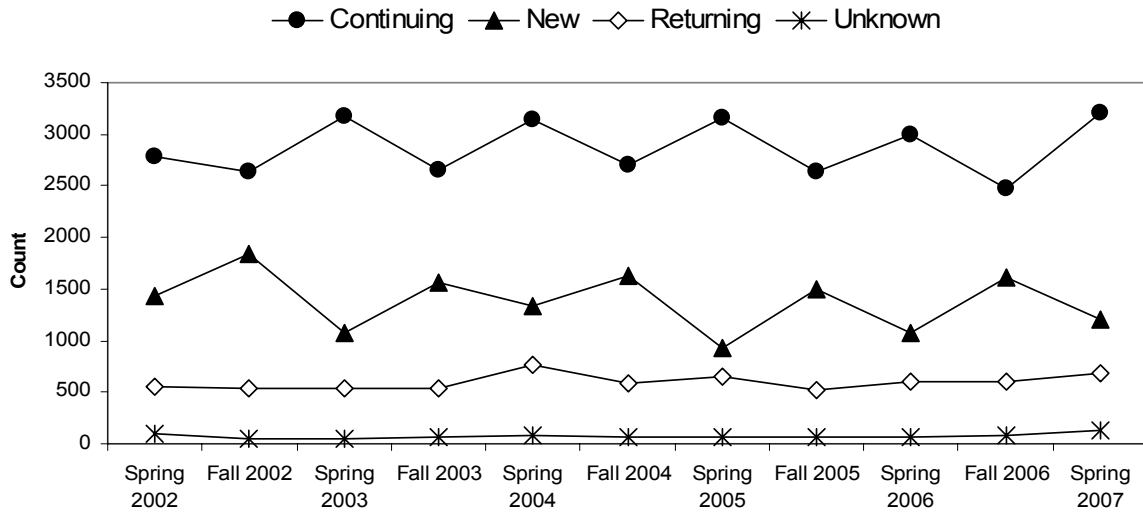
■ Day Only ▨ Evening Only □ Both Day and Evening

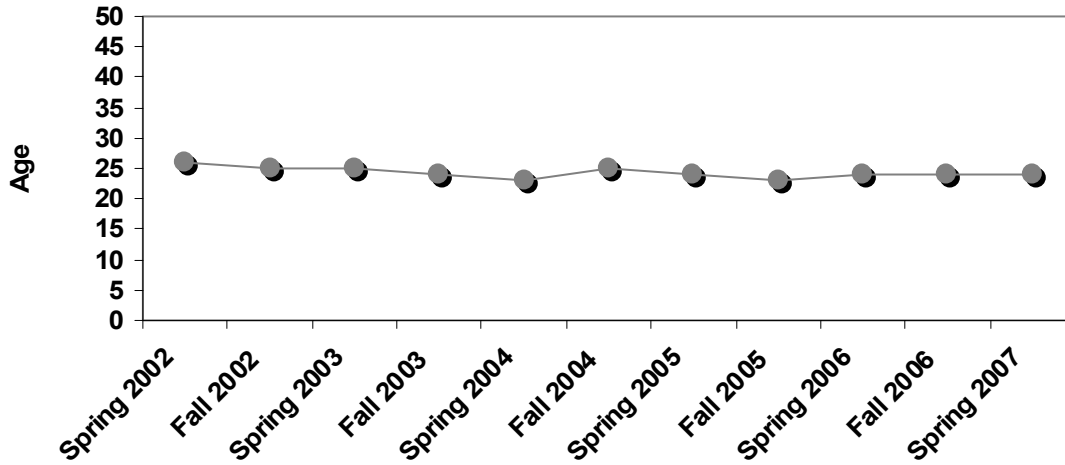

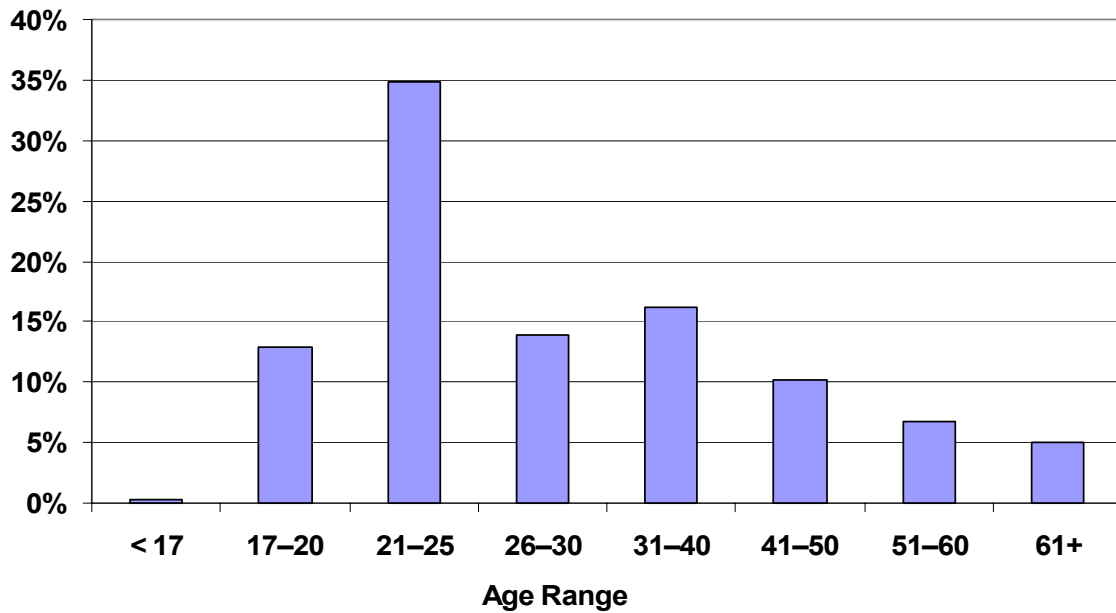


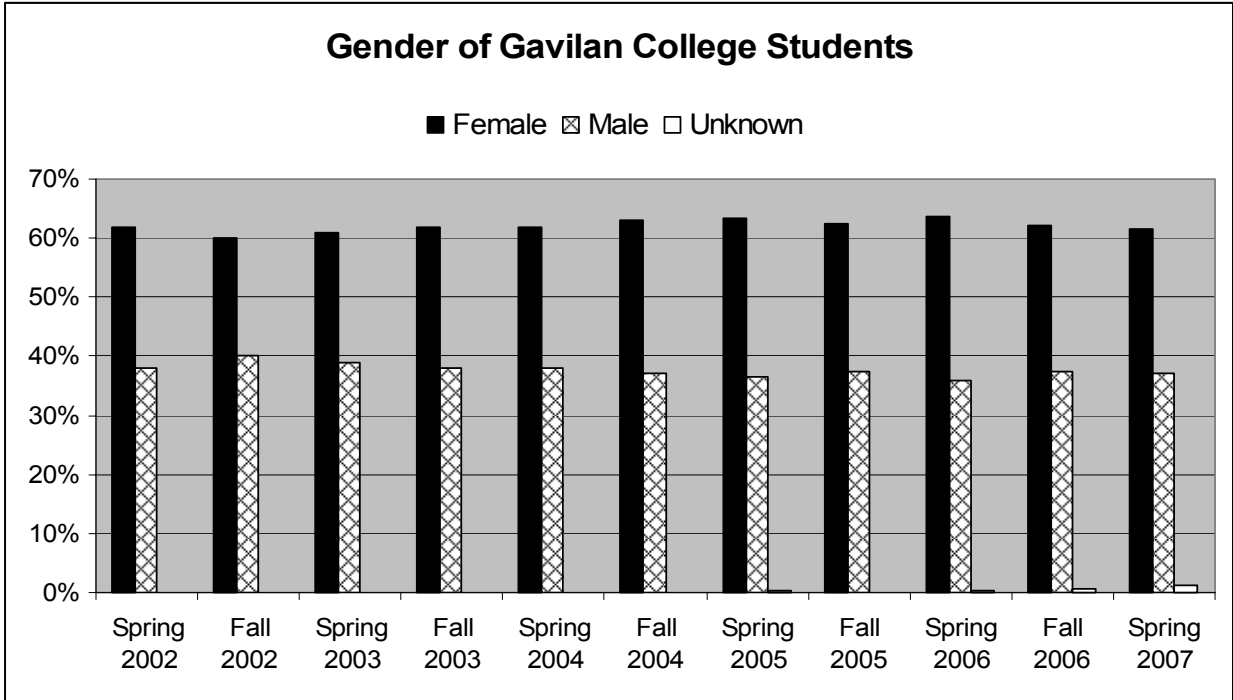

Median Age of Gavilan College Students



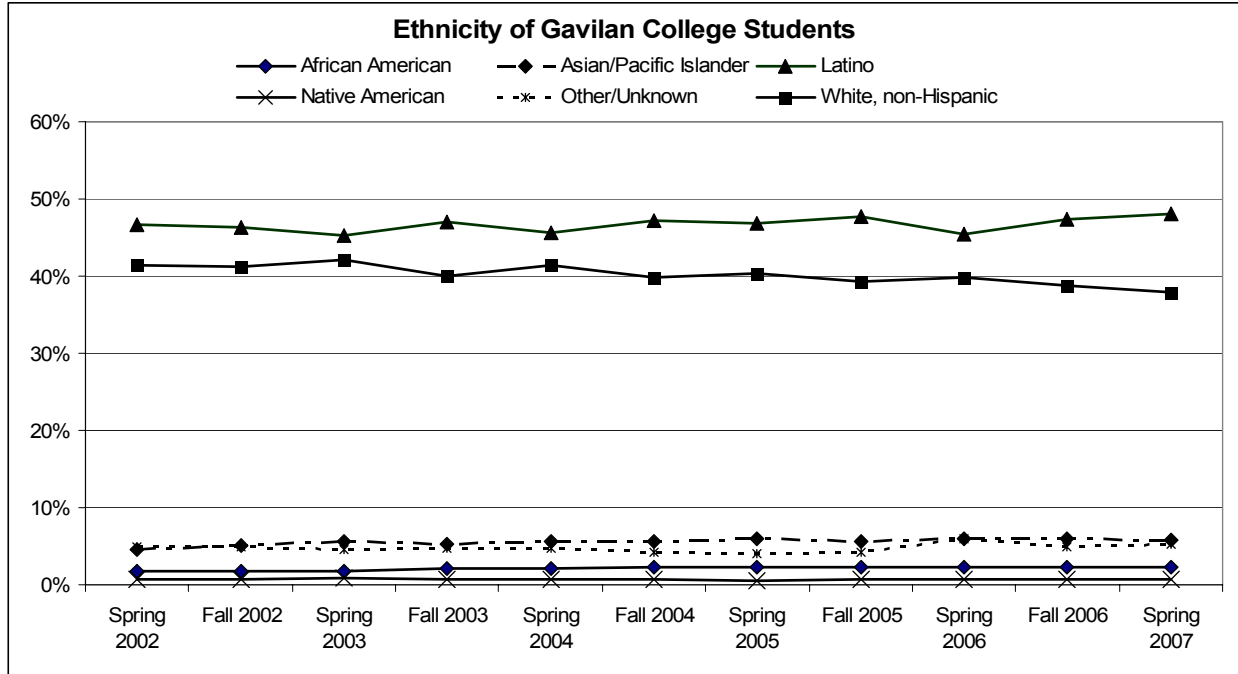
Age Distribution of Gavilan Students, Spring 2007
