



## Student Profile of Opening Enrollment

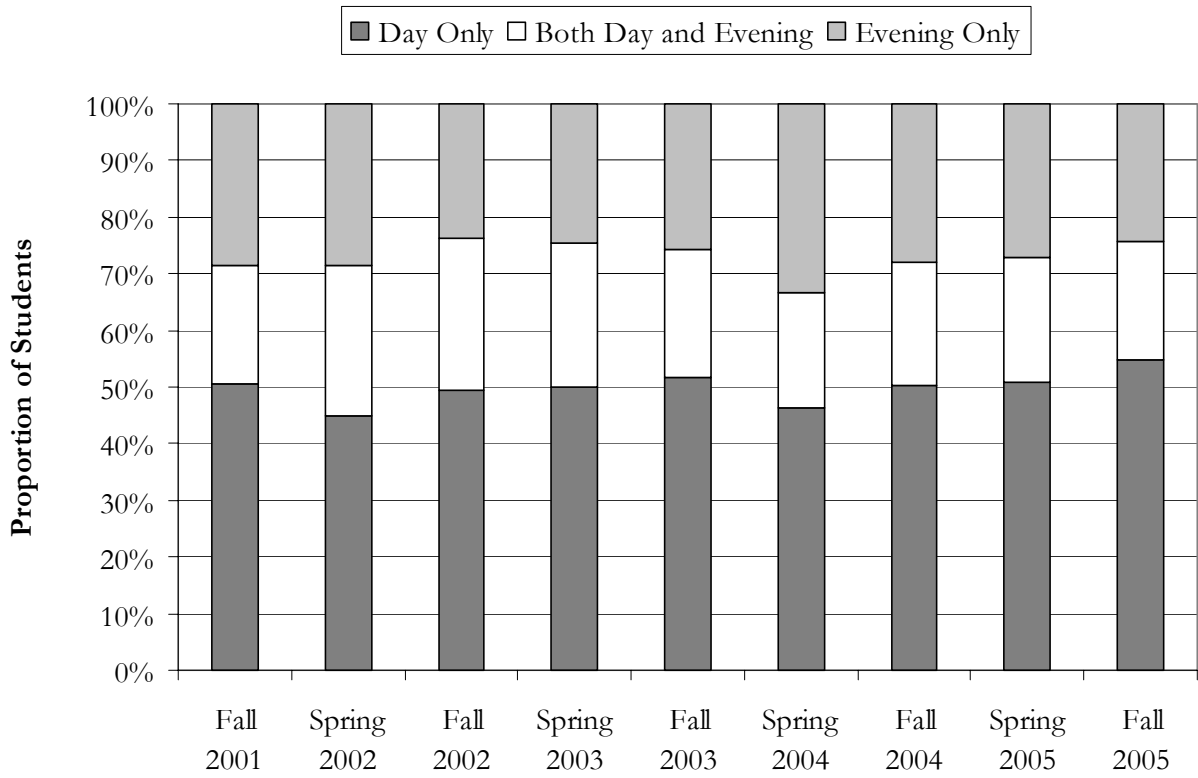
Fall 2001 – Fall 2005

### Highlights

- More students are enrolling in day classes with a decline in those enrolling in evening only.
- The trend of more continuing students enrolling in the Fall continues to increase.
- The median age of Gavilan students has declined from 25 to 23 in the last two years.
- Gender proportions have remained fairly constant with about 3 females for every 2 males.
- Ethnic proportions are very similar to last year.
- Distance ed classes appear to draw college experienced, native English speaking, transfer or career oriented students with at least a small number of from beyond our service area.

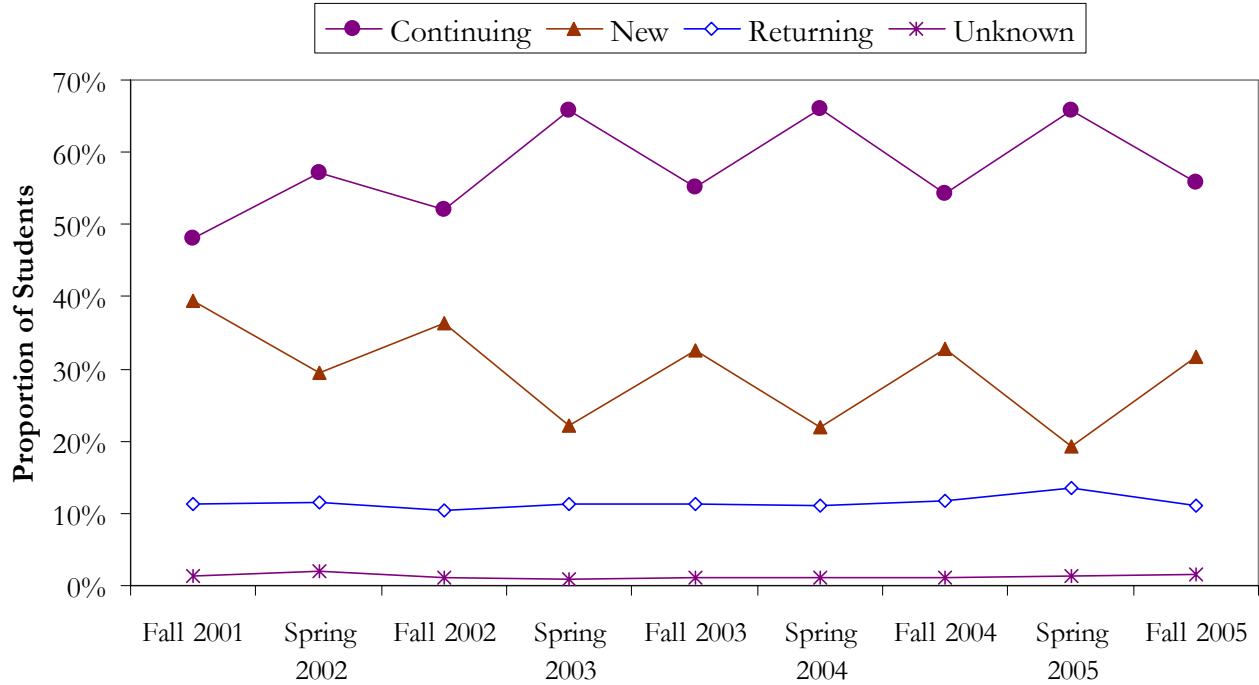

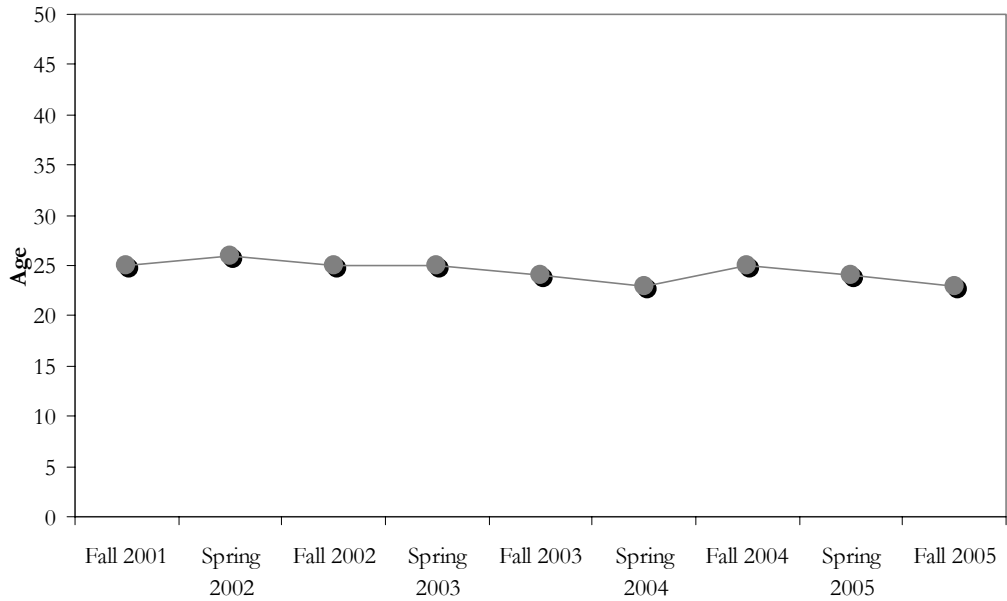

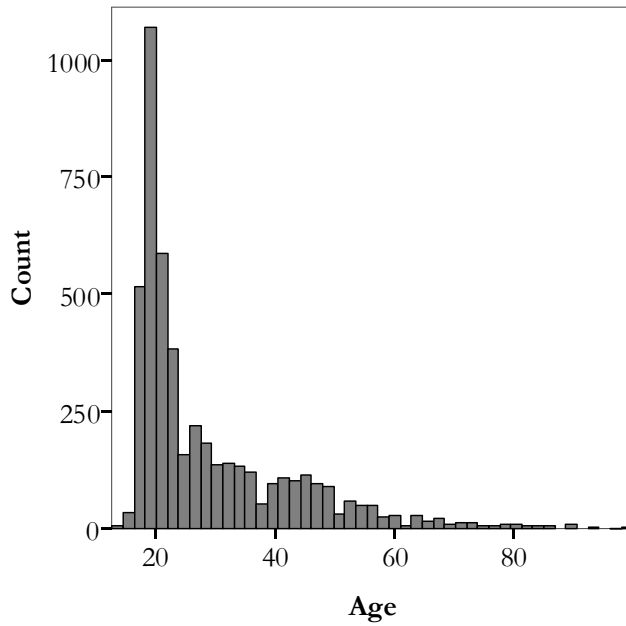

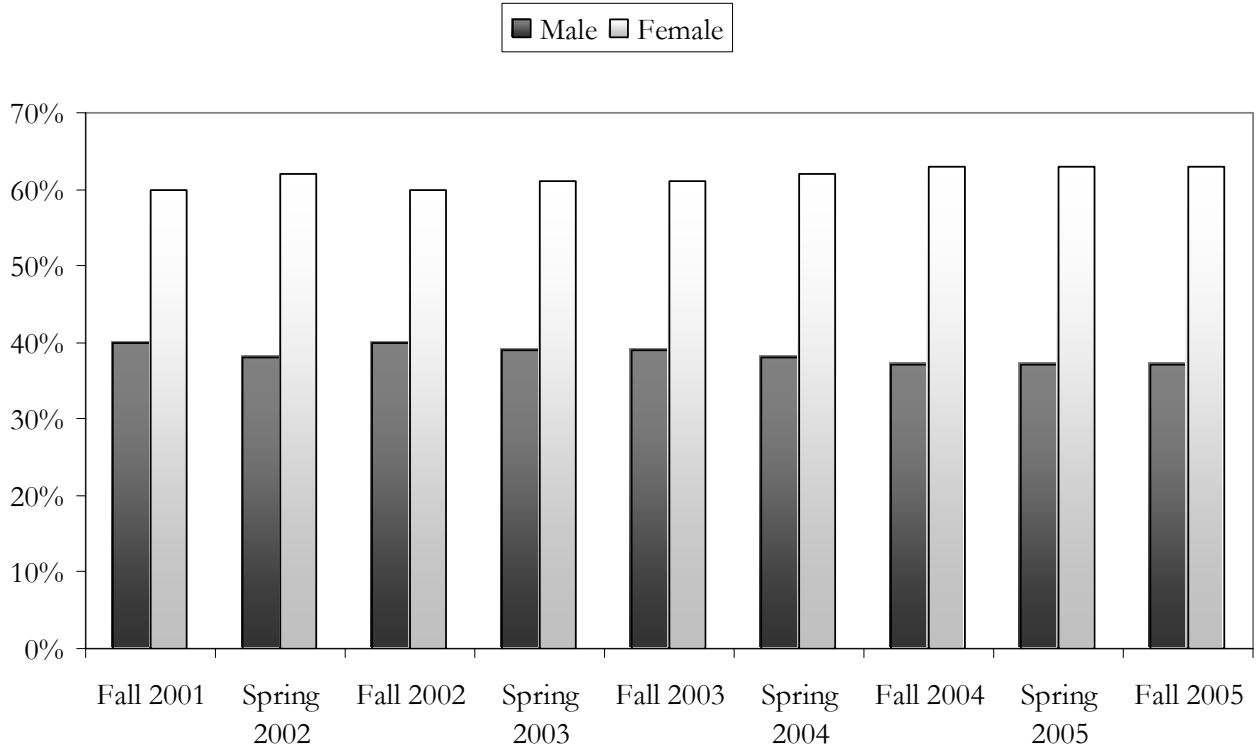

### Age Distribution of Gavilan College Students Fall 2005

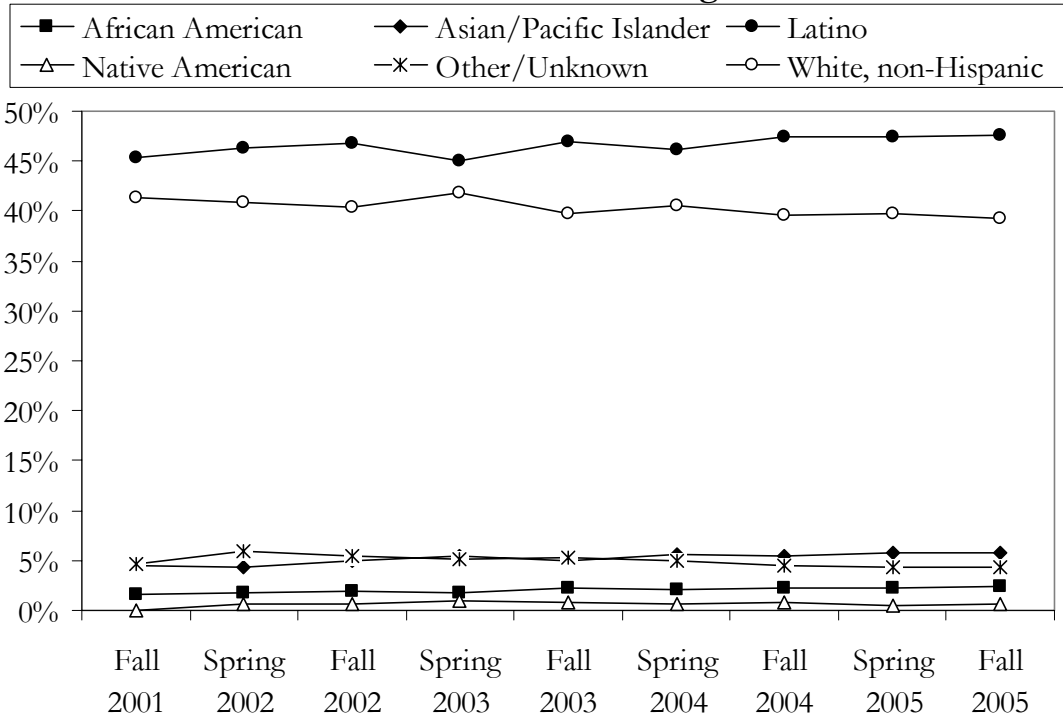

## Focus on Distance Education

This Fall, we are offering 29 distance education classes with about 640 enrollments. A classification and regression tree analysis indicates that the typical Fall 2005 distance education student is characterized by:

- Prior college experience at Gavilan beyond 10 cumulative attempted units
- Native English speaking
- Transfer or career oriented

Neither age, gender, or ethnicity appear related to the decision to take a distance education class. Our distance education classes appear successful in drawing at least a few students from outside our service area including an out of state student. Within our district, distance education classes appear proportionately more appealing to students in the northern end of the district.
