

Graduation Requirements:

1. File a Petition to Graduate with the Admissions & Records Office by April 1st for Spring or Summer graduation, and by October 1st to graduate at the end of the Fall semester. One petition must be filed for each Associate Degree, Certificate of Achievement or Certificate of Proficiency the student expects to receive.
2. Maintain a cumulative grade point average of 2.0, "C" or higher for all work attempted and a grade of "C" or higher in each major or certificate courses.
3. Complete a minimum of 18 units of coursework in a major. Specific major course requirements are listed in the college catalog.
4. Complete a minimum of 60 semester units. Within the 60-unit requirement, the 9 units in Area A and B-4 must be completed with a grade of "C" or better in each course. Complete 12 units at Gavilan College.
