Who is Eligible?

In order to be eligible you must be:

ADD CODES: To add

Refunds: Refunds of the enrollment fee, Health Services fee, parking fee and/or other fees are not automatic. To receive a refund for a term-long course, even for a cancelled course, the student is required to file a Petition for Refund form, available from the Admissions and Records Office. 100% of the enrollment fee minus a \$10 processing fee will be refunded if termlong courses are officially dropped by Friday, June 20 and a Request for Refund form filed no later than noon on June 27. No refunds will be given for requests made after this date. Parking Permits must be returned to receive a refund of parking fees.

Short-term courses must be dropped before 10% of the class meetings have passed.

Adding Courses Students may add courses to their schedules until the end of the second day of the six-week term contingent upon seat availability. To add a course once the course is filled (closed), an add code is required.

Students adding courses with a start date earlier or later than June 18 must be registered by the first day of the class.

Dropping Courses Students may drop courses online at Self-Service Banner or in person. A student who stops attending and does not officially withdraw is not automatically dropped and may receive a final grade of "F" or "NC".

Six-week courses dropped by Thursday, June 26 will not appear on the student's permanent record. Classes dropped between June 27 and July 18 will appear on the permanent record with a notation of "W" (withdrawn).

The "W" deadline for all courses is 75% of the class meetings.

Parking Student spaces are enforced Monday through Thursday from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. and Friday from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Student parking is permitted in Lots A, C, E or H except where restricted to staff, visitors or handicapped. All vehicles parked on campus must display a parking permit. Day tickets are available for 75 cents at coin-operated machines in parking lots A & E and at the south entrance to campus. All-day permits for the four or six-week Summer Session are \$20 and are available from the Admissions and Records Office.

Summer Distance Education Courses



Online

Online courses allow students who have access to a computer with Internet connection to take college credit classes. Students need to have access to a computer, to an individual email account and to the World Wide Web. Students enrolled in these Internet-delivered classes will meet with their instructors and with their classmates through the Internet. The majority of coursework is done online. However, one or more on-campus meetings may be required. If this is a problem, you may contact your instructor for possible accommodations.

It is your responsibility to log into your class during the first week of class.





AJ 10 Introduction to the Administration of Justice

Transferable: CSU, UC; CAN;AJ2

The history and philosophy of justice as it evolved throughout the world; in-depth study of the American system and various sub-systems; roles and role expectations of criminal justice agents in their interrelationships in society; concepts of crime causations, punishments and rehabilitation; ethics, education and training for professionalism in the social system. ADVISORY: Eligible for English 250 and English 260.

ALLIED HEALTH

AH 11 Nutrition

Transferable: CSU, UC; CSU-GE:E2; GAV-GE: E2, F; CAN:FCS2

This course is designed to meet the needs of the Allied Health student and the general education student alike. The major aim of this course is to help the student acquire relevant information about nutrition which they can use professionally and/or personally. The course will cover the practical aspects of normal nutrition, ways to promote sound eating habits throughout the life cycle, and physiological contribution nutrients make to body structure and function. This course is also listed as BIO 11. PREREQUISITE: Eligible for English 250 and English 260. ADVISORY: Chemistry 30A and Mathematics 205.

This online class will be delivered entirely over the Internet. After enrolling, start the class by going to http://www.gavilan.edu/disted, and log into the system. Students who have not logged in by 5 pm on the 3rd day may be dropped from the class.

AH 15 Survey of Human Anatomy and Physiology

Transferable: CSU, UC; CSU-GE:B3, B2; IGETC:5B; GAV-GE: B2, B3, E2

An introductory study of the structure and function of the human body. Includes study at the cellular and organ system levels, emphasizing integration of systems. Note that a cadaver will be observed in this course. This course is also listed as BIO 15. ADVISORY: Eligible for English 250, English 260, Biological Science 10 and Mathematics 205. Course will include viewing of a cadaver.

This hybrid class will meet face-to-face TuWTh 3 hours a day on campus for Lab (choose one below) and online for Lecture throughout the week. AH 32 Basic Cardiac Life Support

Transferable: CSU

Course designed to teach students skills in adult, child and infant cardiopulmonary resuscitation. Specifically designed for health professionals. Successful completion will result in certification by the American Heart Association or American Red Cross. This is a pass/no pass course. May be repeated up to three times for credit. Additional \$3.00 due upon completion for certification card.






